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## 1. PURPOSE:

- 1.1 Establish quality standard anesthesia care for patient's safety.

## 2. DEFINITONS:

- 2.1 **Pre-Induction Evaluation** – is the immediate pre anesthesia assessment done by Anesthesia Physician.

## 3. POLICY:

- 3.1 Pre-anesthetic evaluation and preparation means that a physician anesthesiologist before the delivery of anesthesia care, is responsible for:
  - 3.1.1 Reviewing the available medical record.
  - 3.1.2 Interviewing [if possible, certain circumstances may prevent (e.g., emergent surgery, coma, etc)] and performing a focused examination of the patient to:
    - 3.1.2.1 Discuss the medical history, including previous anesthetic experiences and medical therapy.
    - 3.1.2.2 Assess those aspects of the patient's physical condition that might affect decisions regarding perioperative risk and management.
  - 3.1.3 Ordering and reviewing pertinent available tests and consultations as necessary for the delivery of anesthesia care.

## 4. PROCEDURE:

- 4.1 Perianesthetic care means being responsible for:
  - 4.1.1 Re-evaluation of the patient immediately prior to induction.
  - 4.1.2 Premedication and psychological support of patients prior to anesthesia.
  - 4.1.3 Preparation and check of equipment, drugs, fluids and gas supplies.
  - 4.1.4 Appropriate monitoring of the patient's vital data.
  - 4.1.5 Selection and administration of anesthetic agents to render the patient insensible to pain, while providing a level of comfort and relaxation commensurate with the invasiveness and physiologic stress of the planned procedure.
  - 4.1.6 Support of life functions under the stress of anesthetic, surgical, obstetrical and procedural manipulations.
  - 4.1.7 Recording the pertinent events of the procedure.
